



Expectations for IP and Data rights under AARC-supported research projects

The AeroAcoustics Research Consortium (AARC) is supported by Industry Member dues and a grant from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA). As such, the evaluation of proposals for potential research projects submitted to AARC includes a heavy weighting toward the relevance of the proposed work to Industry Members' and NASA technical priorities and the potential usefulness of the targeted results to their in-house research. In order for Members to make the best use of any knowledge gained under AARC projects, it is necessary for them to have access to the targeted Intellectual Property and Data generated. As Administrator for AARC, OAI will require an ownership stake in said IP and Data developed under AARC projects. As dictated by the terms of the Joint Collaboration Agreement (JCA), which governs Industry membership in AARC and Members' rights under NASA-supported projects, OAI will grant Industry Members a nonexclusive, nontransferable, irrevocable, paid-up license, with the right to sublicense, any such IP and Data generated under research projects funded by Industry Member dues. Research projects funded under the NASA grant to AARC will be subject to additional clauses, including those concerning U. S. Government Patent and Data rights, as dictated by the NASA award. In these cases, the JCA states that OAI will grant to the Industry Members a nonexclusive, nontransferable, irrevocable, paid-up license, without the right to sublicense, to the IP and Data from these projects, consistent with the terms of the NASA award. Potential Researchers should include a statement in their proposals acknowledging these requirements.
